

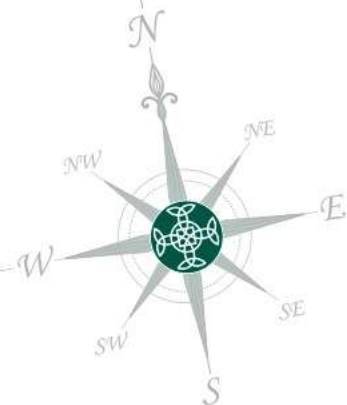

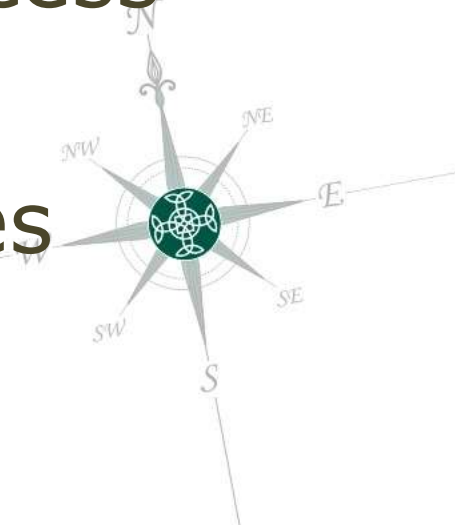

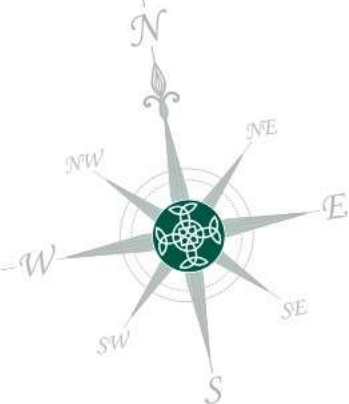

Challenges

- The current programme is working well. Learning must not be affected.
- Programme must be affordable and sustainable for parents
- Parents must have choice over when to replace a device
- Insurance must be easy to understand and consistent



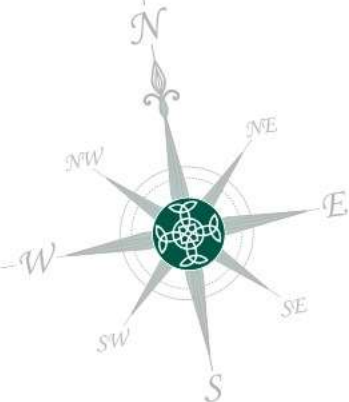
Changes

- Lease programme being phased out.
 - Students joining the programme at Y5
 - provide own machine
 - Students moving to Y6 or Y7
 - *either* provide own machine, or continue to lease
 - Students joining the College at Y7 or Y9
 - provide own machine
 - Students moving from Y7 to Y8
 - provide own machine
 - 3 year life-cycle recommended. 4 and 5 year life-cycle supported
- Insurance bundled with College programme



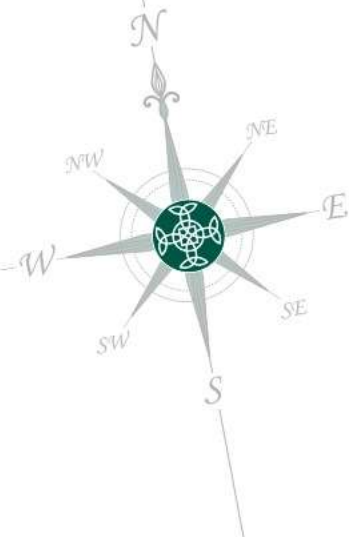
2012 programme

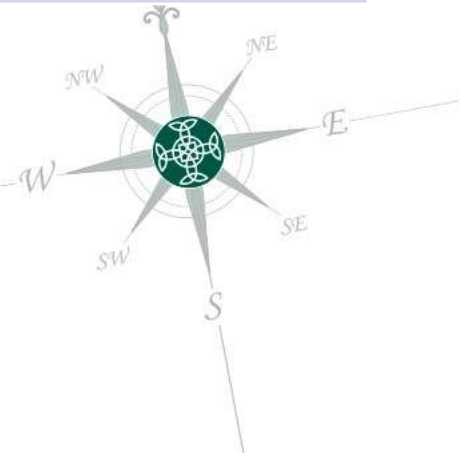

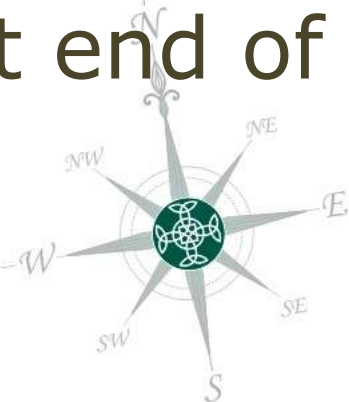

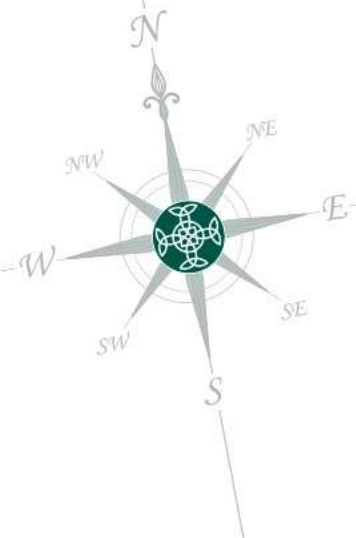
Where to from here

Where to from here

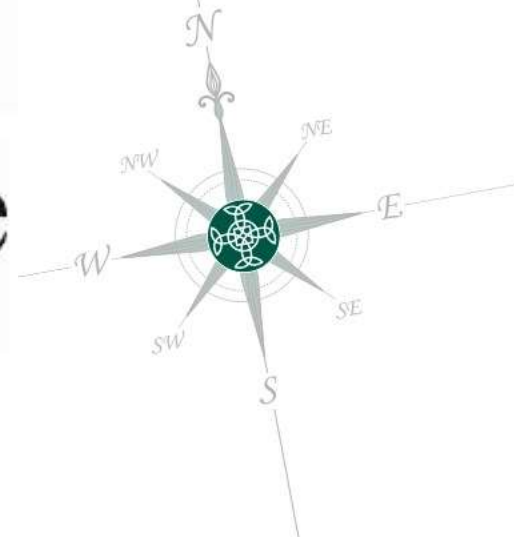
- Year 5 - Notebooks issued to students at start of Term 1

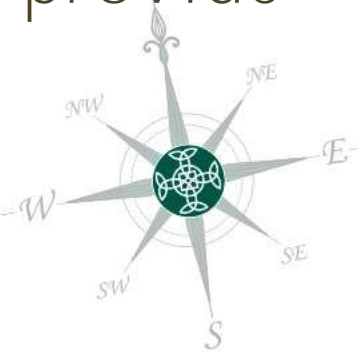
Between Home and School

- Y5 and Y7: Notebook will not come home in the first 3 weeks of the term, as these girls are just starting the programme. After that they can come home at any time, although they may be left at school.
- Y6 and Y8 can come home straightaway if desired. Y6 and Y8 students should already have established management skills and so don't need this time.
- The decision whether to take the notebook home is the parents' and student's, rather than the teacher's.
- During the first three weeks, there will be lessons on posture and care.



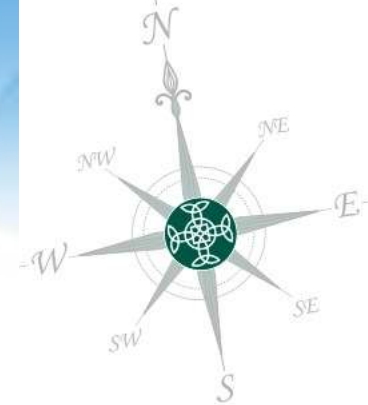
After-school Activities and Gear

- Teachers try to avoid setting homework involving the use of notebooks on days where students have after-school activities involving additional equipment (eg hockey, music)
- The back-packs available from Blackwatch House are ergonomically designed to provide back-support to the students.

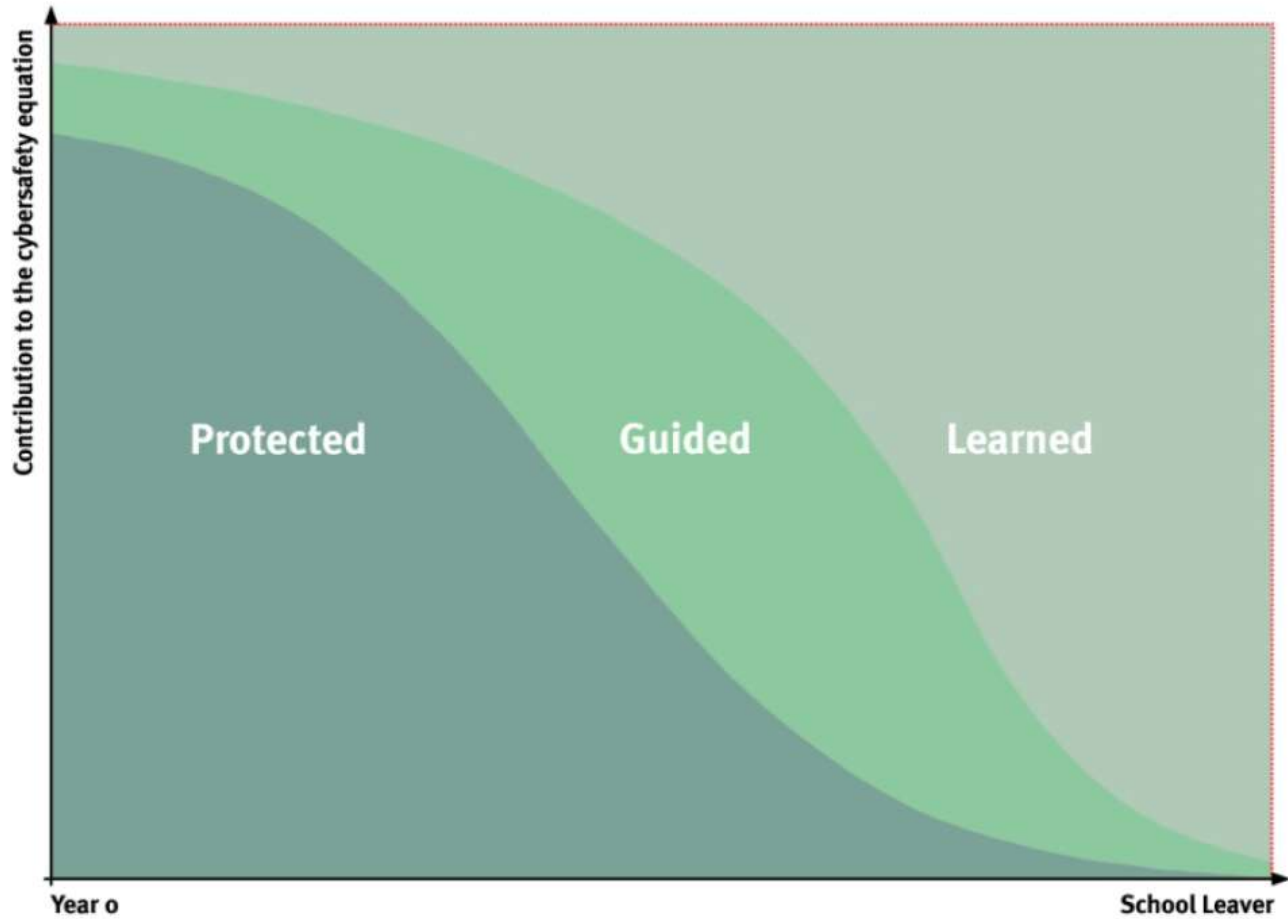
The St Cuthbert's College approach to Digital Literacy.



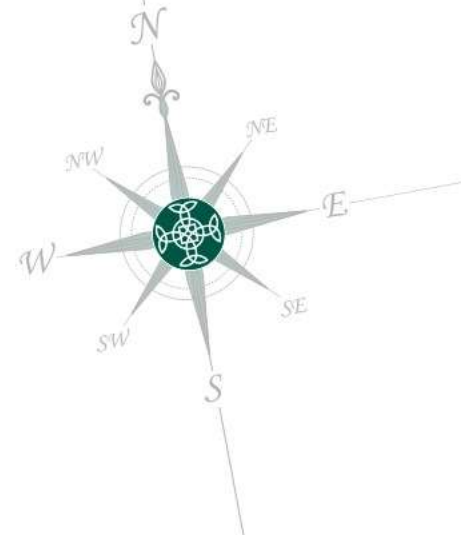

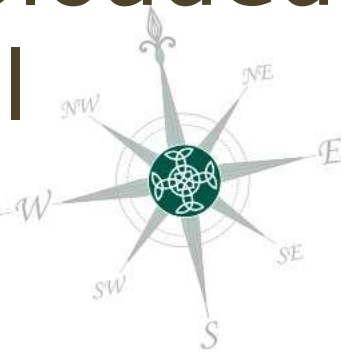
4. Registration and Account Security

1. You will not provide any false personal information on Facebook, or create an account for anyone other than yourself without permission.
2. You will not create more than one personal profile.
3. If we disable your account, you will not create another one without our permission.
4. You will not use your personal profile for your own commercial gain (such as selling your status update to an advertiser).
5. You will not use Facebook if you are under 13.

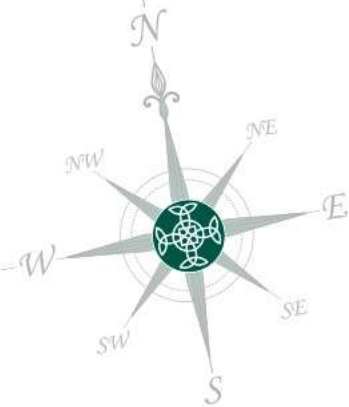

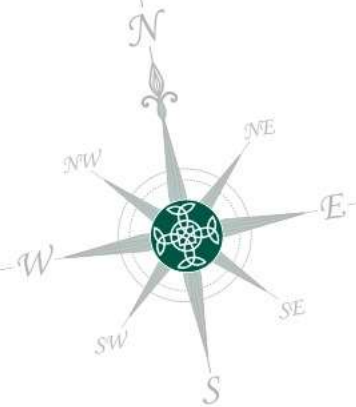

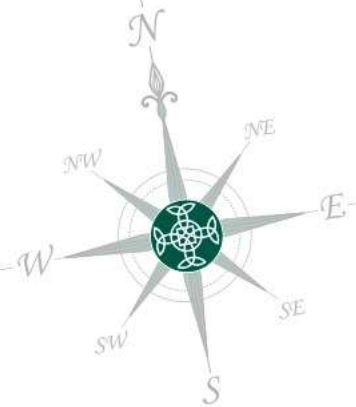
